1



Issue Arises

A resident concern, staff issue, policy idea, development request, contract matter, or operational need appears.

2



Staff Review

Staff gathers facts, determines the department involved, and assesses whether action is needed.

3



Legal / Authority Review

The city evaluates legal authority, procedural requirements, risks, and constraints.

4



Agenda Preparation

The item is shaped into a council-ready item such as an ordinance, resolution, contract approval, executive session item, or discussion item.

5



Backup Materials

Supporting documents, staff summaries, fiscal implications, contracts, and recommendations are assembled.

6



Posting / Public Notice

The agenda is posted under Texas open meetings requirements so the public knows what may be discussed or acted on.

7



Council Meeting

The mayor and council discuss the item within the posted agenda and hear public input where applicable.

8



Motion / Vote / Direction

Council may approve, deny, amend, table, or direct staff.

9



Implementation

The real work continues after the meeting through contracts, purchasing, records, communications, enforcement, or follow-up.



Most agenda outcomes are shaped before the meeting.

Legal authority and backup matter.



The vote is not the end of the process.
